Sigríður is head of Division of Health Information and Research at the Directorate of Health in Iceland. She completed a PhD in Public Health from the University of Iceland and an MA degree in Health Geography from York University, Toronto Canada.

Her career at the Directorate of Health has been devoted to creating and developing a national health information system. Initially her work focused on leading the establishment of national, electronic health registers.
